JOY SCOTT has been awarded the OBE in King Charles Birthday Honours.

Joy received the honour for services to social housing in Northern Ireland, having served as chair of Clanmil Housing. Speaking of her "absolute delight' on receiving news of the award, she stressed the honour 'reflects on Clanmil', and recognises the team behind the organisation. She said, "I am so pleased as it is recognition for the work Clanmil provides in the social housing sector, and also how it tries to build a community. I was part of a team, which works very hard and does tremendous work under all sorts of constraints."

Having been a board member of Clanmil for nine years, Joy served as vice chair before taking up the post of chair in 2019.

Joy is a former solicitor, having studied law at Queens University Belfast. She became an articled clerk with the Law firm Carson and McDowell in Belfast in 1975, and when fully qualified, joined the legal team at the then Department of Environment. She returned to private practice five years later eventually becoming a partner with Cleaver, Fulton and Rankin. She was with the firm for 37 years before retiring.

A dedicated member of our congregation Joy has served as an elder and former Clerk of Session for several years. She has a heart for the children and youth of the congregation, having previously served a Bible Class leader and in more recent years helping with the summer Holiday Bible Club and the Summer Blitz. WHAT IS SMALL GROUP BIBLE STUDY?



Imagine if someone asked you if you would like to go back to school and start learning something new. Most of us would probably run in the opposite direction. The thought of sitting in a classroom with a teacher talking at you might just fill you with dread. Perhaps that is the way you feel when in church I talk about Bible study and our small groups.

On a Wednesday night there are about 16 people and on a Friday lunchtime up to 10 people present. Before we meet there will be a passage or two from the Bible that each person will have read at home. When we meet there will be

some questions that help to guide us through the passage, exploring what it is saying and what we can learn from it. But don't worry if you are the sort of person who just likes to sit and listen, nobody is made to speak or share, it is entirely voluntary. And we always end up going off on a sidetrack because as we talk together, our own questions come up and we explore these together.

It is not all serious faces, we do actually laugh together and have fun, because life is a mixture of serious and light-hearted and so Bible study is as well. We get to know each other better, we enjoy the fellowship as well as the learning. We always end with a time of prayer, and no one is pressurised into praying.

In September we will be starting a study on the book of Hebrews; this would be a perfect time to give Bible study a go. So why not come along and join us, we would really love to see you there? **Jeff**

COMPASSION UK SPONSORSHIP

Tots and Toddlers have been sponsoring Heidy for over 13 years. This is through Compassion UK which was founded in 1952 and currently works in 29 countries partnering with 8600 local churches within communities experiencing poverty.

Heidy is 17 and from Colombia. She lives with her mum and brothers not far from the capital Bogotá. She enjoys school and really likes soccer.



The project that supports Heidy provides her with many different opportunities and lessons. There are Bible lessons and songs, letter writing to us, her sponsors, as well as social lessons, our children would call that LLW, (learning for life and work). Then there are sport and music workshops, vocational training and career planning. She also receives two lunches of rice and beans and two snacks per week.

This summer Heidy graduated from the Compassion project and will be joining the army. Please pray for her as she starts this new chapter in her life.



TREASURER'S REPORT (2023 ACCOUNTS)

We currently have 156 contributing families in the congregation, including 11 new contributing families in 2023, and we are very encouraged to have an increasing number of members.

The 2 Pie Charts in this short report show the total Income and Expenditure (Payments) during 2023 for each of the 3 accounts that we operate (i.e. General A/c, Property A/c and Mission A/c).

Income

The income we receive from our members across the 3 accounts are by far the biggest slice of the Pie! And we would like to thank the congregation for their generous support during 2023.

Each year our income from member donations and Gift Aid is supplemented by the investment income we receive from our bequest investments. In 2023, a further £34,000 of income was received from bequest investments of which £27,000 was in respect of the Thomas Strean bequest.

The monthly Property and Mission contributions plus the donations from the Antiques & Christmas Fairs (raised by the Fund Raising Committee), as well as Harvest contributions, all helped greatly to increase our income.

We are very encouraged that an increasing number of members are making their contributions by standing order. If you currently make your contribution using FWO Envelopes and would like to change to online banking, then the details you need are:



STAINED GLASS WINDOWS AT STREAN

THE GOOD SHEPHERD

One of the enjoyable aspects of worshipping in our beautiful Church sanctuary on bright Sunday mornings is looking at the detail of our stained-glass windows. These special works of art add to the beauty and dignity of Church, and help create the atmosphere and spirit of worship within it. They reflect important parts of the history of the congregation, as they honour some who have given devoted Christian service to Strean and to our town as well as those who served in two World Wars.

At the front (or North end) of the Church building, when looking towards the pulpit, the Thomas Strean window is the central and dominant feature. This was erected by the congregation to honour Thomas Strean, the man whose vision and motivation helped establish our congregation back in the mid-1800s.



GIDEON

To either side of the pulpit are two of my favourite windows – of Joshua and Gideon, two Old Testament warriors, and men of strength of purpose and commitment to God. These are the War Memorial Windows which honour those members of Strean who served their country and the cause of freedom in the Great War of 1914-1918. These windows were installed in 1920.

Flanking these windows to the East and West sides are two further single-panel, feature windows. The window in the East transept illustrates Jesus bestowing the Crown of Life on one of his followers, and in the West transept it depicts Jesus as the Good Shepherd with his sheep and is inscribed with an extract from the 23rd Psalm. These two windows were presented in 1924 in memory of Hugh James Johnston of Kiltonga – and so they celebrate their centenary this year (in 2024!!) These four windows at the front of Strean were designed and installed by Ward & Partners.

Another window was installed in 1964, with the following inscription:

This window was erected in thankfulness to Almighty God by the pupils and past pupils of Tullynagardy Sunday school on the completion by Mr John Colville of fifty years as Superintendent, 1913 – 1963, sowing the seed of the Word, in the school founded by his father.



THE CROWN OF LIFE



The window has two figures. The first is a woman sewing the seed, and the second is a man, harvesting – depicted by sheaths of wheat and a sickle. At the top of the window we see the ark and an anchor.

This window is of note because it was designed and installed by Clokey, Stained Glass Studios, Belfast, one of only a small number of stained-glass window designers across Ireland at that time.

The Clokey family were of Huguenot origin, with the first known entry of early stained-glass work by Andrew Clokey of Magheragall in 1719. His descendant, Walter Francis Clokey (1870 – 1930) founded Clokey Stained Glass studios in Belfast in 1904, and it operated under his direction and then his son, Harold, until around 1972.

The studio had a number of famous artists and designers including Olive Henry, and many connections to Ward & Partners (see above), as well as direct links

with Campbell Brothers, glass merchants in Belfast. Unfortunately many of their original paper designs were lost in a fire at the studios in 1970.

Clokey windows adorn churches throughout Ireland, and are held in very high regard. Other important buildings, such as Belfast City Hall, include examples of Clokey windows.

It is important to remember that all of these windows miraculously survived the terrorist bomb which caused so much damage to buildings in the middle of our town, including our Church, in July 1993.

So, next time you are in Church, perhaps take a few minutes to study the detail of these fine windows and the important messages which they continue to bring to the generations in Strean






SUMMER BLITZ 2024

If it's summer – it must be Summer Blitz time! The following is a reflection on 3 brilliant days in late July for 41 of Strean's young people and 13 leaders, as they took part in our fourth annual Summer Blitz programme.

Summer Blitz is a 3-day, high intensity outdoor activity programme for young people who are all connected to Strean through BB, GB, Youth Club and Youth Fellowship. The purpose of Blitz is to connect our young people, to stretch and challenge them through a variety of experiences, to get alongside them, and to share God's Word and Love with them.





What did we do?

Before the residential we held an ice breaker event on Wednesday 24th July, funded by a community grant award from John Gray & Co, Funeral Directors. The group took part in a Street Detectives challenge and also an interactive and very noisy session with Joe Loughlin of The Gathering Drum.







We assembled at Delamont on the morning of Monday 29th July, in our bright pink Blitz t-shirts and to beautiful sunshine. We used the morning to receive briefings from the Delamont instructors, to find our sleeping accommodation, and get everyone familiarised with the centre.

Over the next 2 ¹/₂ days, the Blitzers were split into 4 groups and undertook a rotation of 4 exciting activities. The leaders tried to keep up but the young folk were bursting with energy, talent and most importantly - determination!



In addition, we had evening activities -Nightline on the Monday evening, where participants had to work their way around a forest trail whilst blindfolded and Camp Fire skills on the Tuesday evening, the highlight of which was enjoying toasted marshmallows.







We also brought some additional activities with us. We set up a Creative Craft zone where some of the Blitzers got an opportunity to make a range of craft items. Then there was our Late Night Hunt played at a frenetic pace and with great enthusiasm by the Blitzers both nights.



Here's what two of our young people said:

Matthew - We had a great few days at Blitz which was over far too soon. We had amazing weather and lots of different activities to do, such as mountain biking, climbing, kayaking, and my favourite, banana boating. Alongside the activities our leaders took devotions twice a day where we explored the theme of "Who am I?". These were definitely the best 3 days of summer and I cannot wait for the next Blitz!





Sara – Summer Blitz was the highlight of summer for my friends and I – it is every year! We had lots of opportunities to try new things like paddle boarding, kayaking, mountain biking etc. My favourite thing was banana boating. My friends and I also really enjoyed the night line as it was very funny and was a challenge for many of us. I made lots of new friends and became closer with those I'm already friends with.

Who Am I?

The theme for Blitz 24 was Who Am I? Jeff prepared 5 devotion sessions based on the theme, and different leaders took the early morning and late evening devotion periods.

And thanks to an anonymous and generous donation, we were able to provide each Blitzer with a 3-month bible study guide called "Engage – Connecting You With God's Word" – the purpose of which was encourage each young person to study God's Word in a structured way and find answers to lots of their questions.



What did Blitz 24 achieve?

Blitz exceeded our expectations in so many ways. The young people were simply fantastic – listening to instructions, always smiling, being considerate of each other and our leaders, and throwing themselves into each activity with genuine enthusiasm.

Our hope, as leaders, was to re-fuel each young person in their commitment to Strean and our youth activities, and to help them understand about how special and unique they all are in God's eyes.
